

## **Tintern Fete 2019**

### **Stallholder Pricing Policy and Regulations**

#### **Stallholder Pricing**

In 2018, Tintern Fete was a resounding success with visitor numbers reaching approximately 3,000 over the course of the day. This was an increase on the approximately 1,000 visitors in 2017, which up to that point had been our most well attended fete. The increase in numbers was mainly the result of a concerted social media campaign that we will repeat in 2019. We had a significant number of visitors from the Bristol area, and anticipate that with the removal of the tolls on the Severn Bridges at the end of 2018, there is potential to attract more people from Bristol, North Somerset and the M4 corridor.

However, the cost of organising the fete is also increasing and in 2018, despite the high number of visitors, we only just broke even and the income we raised included a substantial grant from the Tintern Community Council and months of fundraising in the run up to the fete, mainly from Tintern residents.

For these reasons, we have reviewed our pricing to stallholders and, with regret, we will be raising the price in 2019 for commercial stallholders. Pitches will be priced at flat rate of £25.00. This is the first increase since 2012.

We have a number of stalls run by charities and local volunteer groups that we have not charged for pitches in the past. We will continue our policy of providing pitches for these groups free of charge. The decision not to charge any stallholder or organisation running a stall is solely at the discretion of the Tintern Festivals Association (Fete Sub-Committee).

#### **Stallholder Regulations**

Tintern Festivals Association welcomes you to the Tintern Fete, 2019 and would like to draw your attention to the points listed below.

Stalls should be set up on the field behind the Anchor pub by 12.00pm.

Your plot, which measures approximately 3m x 3m for a single unit or 3m x 6m for a double unit, will be marked out and you will be directed to it.

Stallholders must provide their own furniture and shelter.

There is no electrical supply.

Alcoholic drinks must not be sold for consumption on the field. If you are selling any such drinks in bottles you must indicate this restriction clearly on your stall.

Food for consumption at the fete must not be sold except by prior agreement with us. Specialist craft producers are exempt from this.

The Festival Committee will be obtaining public liability insurance cover for the fete field as a whole, but the organisers of the event cannot be responsible for any injury, damage or loss incurred by stalls, and you are therefore advised to obtain your own public liability insurance in relation to the products for sale and activities on your stall.

All stall-holders are required to have carried out their own Risk Assessment to comply with the Management of Health & Safety at Work Regulations 1992.

Display of livestock must comply with WAG, DEFRA, The Local Authority, and Health and Safety regulations.

Access to the field is from the main A466 Chepstow to Monmouth. Take the turning at the sign indicating Tintern Abbey. Proceed to the end of this road and at the mini-roundabout, turn left along the river bank behind the Anchor pub, and after about 20 yards turn left again into the Anchor Field.

A steward will be at the entrance to the field to direct you to your plot. After offloading your stall components, you should park your vehicle in the area indicated by a steward. Only one vehicle per stall is permitted. Please do not park anywhere else on the field.

Stallholders will be expected to keep their stalls in operation until at least 5.00pm but no closing time has been specified beyond that and you are very welcome to stay open for as long as you wish and to join us for the evening entertainment which will take place in the field. Please ensure that all your stall components are removed from the field by 11.00am on Sunday 30th. June and that any litter you may have is securely removed for disposal by you.

The Association cannot make any recompense to you should there be cancellation or severe curtailment of the event as a result of circumstances beyond our control.
